Announcements:

Jerry Swingle announced that the 2010 Regional Orthophotography project with MARC was on schedule and we should be receiving images to QA/QC within a few weeks. The 2010 Oblique photography project is almost complete, the desktop based image files have been delivered for 2010, and the web based images should be received by July 15th. Training for the Pictometry apps will proceed on an as needed basis when all the imagery has been received.

Brian Hiller from ESRI announced the July Kansas City ArcInfo User's Group would be held and hosted by Johnson County AIMS on July 15th. Agenda is posted on KCAUIG's web site.

Ed Crane from ESRI announced that at next week's User Conference that J.D. Overton from the St. Louis office would be holding numerous presentations on ArcGIS 10.

Presentations:

Jeremy Bixby from Lenexa provided all of the content for the July meeting. Here are the topics that he presented on:

Integrated Community Development Map-

Jeremy demonstrated a new flex/ ArcGIS server application built for the Community Development director and Lenexa planners. Besides GIS data sources, the application uses the Accela database as a source for permits, CIP information, etc. Lenexa's goal was to make a compact, user friendly application for a decision support system. With the implementation of this application, Lenexa hopes to be completely retiring ArcIMS.

Jeremy then gave an overview of upcoming projects, mainly to convert to ArcGIS 10. Jeremy also gave an overview of Lenexa's organizational changes, with the GIS department becoming a part of IT.

With the remaining time, Jeremy showed Lenexa's plans to provide a "Bond Scheduling" application that Lenexa users can use to track changes in property and how it affects the maturation of municipal bonds. Jeremy then gave a brief overview

of their plans for a mobile Accela application to be used out in the field, and their preliminary work on their first Apple iPhone/iPad application.
